BIBLE STORYLINE Jethro's Advice

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Lesson Overview

In today's lesson, we're going to talk about some great advice Moses received from his father in law, Jethro. As we've been learning, Moses had a lot of responsibilities. He was the leader of the Israelites and he was in charge of everything. In fact, the Bible says that every day from morning until night, Moses would listen to the fights people were having with each other and then he would give his ruling based on God's laws. This was exhausting for Moses and Jethro could see that. So, Jethro gave Moses some really good advice. He told Moses to find some smart guys who loved God to be like his helpers. Instead of Moses having to deal with every issue, these guys could deal with some of the smaller problems so Moses would be free to deal with the bigger stuff. Moses loved that idea. It was exactly what he needed to hear. This is a great lesson for us, too. We don't need to do everything on our own. We should ask for help and we should look for ways to help others, too. That way, we won't get stressed out!

Classroom Agenda

- 1. (5 min) Let kids start working on Activity Page #1.
- 2. (5 min) WARM UP: If you were President for a day, what would you do and who would you help? (Tip:Maybe you would make school only 2 hours a day or everyone gets Chic fil A for free on Tuesdays.)
- 3. (5 min) **PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard.** Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) KQ: Answer the Key Question. (Answer: By being kind and willing to serve. (One of the easiest ways to help someone is by simply being kind. Give a nice compliment and be willing to share whatever you have. But also be willing to step in and help when you see a need. Pay attention to how you can help at home. Whether with chores or yard work, or even helping a sibling with homework. Be a servant.)
 - Bonus Questions: How can we help others? Why is it important to serve? 4-5th How has Jesus served us?
- 7. (5 min) EXPLORE: Read <u>Hebrews 13:1-3</u>. What does this passage say people should do for others? How can you be more helpful to the people in your life? Answer: We should love everyone like they're members of our families. We should be welcoming, willing to serve everyone, and even stand up for those that are mistreated. Look for ways to help your parents at home or ways you can be nice to kids at school who don't have a lot of friends.)
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.

(5 min) **CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class.** Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents - and remind them to go online to pursueGODkids.org to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: HELPING HANDS WREATH CRAFT

Instructions:

- Give each kid 4 different colors of construction paper and a pencil.
- Have them trace their handprint on each of the colored pieces. Have them cut out each handprint.
- Have them write down a way they will help someone this week on each hand.
- Have them glue the handprints together, making a wreath.
- Then, read the story of Moses and Jethro from Exodus 18:13-23. Remind the kids how important it is to help and serve others.

Supplies needed: Construction paper, Scissors, Pencils, Glue

OPTION 2:HELPING HANDS RELAY

Instructions:

- Before playing, tape 2 lines next to each other at one end of the room and two lines next to each other at the other end of the room.
- Divide the class into 2 teams. Have the teams line up behind the lines at one end of the room. Give each team the following items: Sunglasses, Adult shirt, Adult slippers, and gloves. Have them place the items on the floor in front of the line. When you say, "Go!", have the teams race to get the first kid in line dressed with all the items. That kid then has to run to the other end of the room to touch the line and back. Then, have the kids help undress and dress the next kid in line. Continue the relay until all the kids have gone. First team to do it, wins.
- If you have time, read the story of Moses and Jethro from Exodus 18:13-23. Remind the kids how important it is to help and serve others.

Supplies needed: Tape, Relay Items (2 Sets: Sunglasses, Adult shirt, Adult slippers, Gloves)


