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Lesson Overview

In today's lesson, we're going to continue talking about Jacob and Esau. Remember, they were twins but Esau was born first. Last week we learned that Esau was willing to give up his birthright, or inheritance, for a bowl of Jacob's yummy stew. Well, today, we're going to learn how Jacob tricked Isaac, his father, into giving him the blessing. Now, Isaac was old and he couldn't see well. He knew he was going to die soon. So, he told Esau to go hunt and then prepare a special meal for him and then he would give him the blessing. Well, Jacob and his mom came up with another plan. They made Isaac's favorite meal and then Jacob dressed up like Esau to trick Isaac into thinking he was Esau. Well, it worked. Isaac thought he blessed Esau, his oldest, but he actually blessed Jacob. So, Esau was out of luck. Once the words of blessing were spoken, it was too late to take them back. Now kids, we don't deal with birthrights anymore but we do deal with the power of our words. Let's learn from this story that we should be careful what we say because our words have power to help or hurt others.

Big Idea

Classroom Agenda

- 1. (5 min) Let kids start working on Activity Page #1.
- 2. (5 min) WARM UP: What's the nicest thing someone has said about you? What are some mean things kids say to each other? (Tip: Hopefully, we all have examples of nice things people have said to us. But sometimes kids can be very mean. God wants us to only use kind words that make people feel good, not bad.)
- 3. (5 min) PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard. Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) KQ: Answer the Key Question. (Answer: Our words can either build others up or tear them down. (Hopefully we have examples of people that have made us feel good with their kind words but we also have probably been hurt by someone's mean words. We need to treat others the way we want to be treated. We should only say things that make people feel good, not bad. Mean words can really hurt and tear down others.)
 - **Bonus Questions:** What can our words do? Why are mean words so hurtful when we hear them? **4-5th** What should you do when you hear someone being mean to someone else? How can mean words affect people?
- 7. (5 min) EXPLORE: Read Ephesians 4:29. What are some examples of words we shouldn't speak to others? What are some examples of kind words we should speak? (Answer: We shouldn't say crude words that our parents tell us not to say. We shouldn't make fun of how other kids look or act. We shouldn't say anything that hurts someone's feelings. We should say encouraging things like giving compliments that make others feel good.)
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.
- 9. (5 min) CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class. Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents and remind them to go online to pursueGODkids.org to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: KIND ACTS PAPER CHAIN CRAFT

Instructions:

- Give each kid a Paper Chain template (page 5). Have kids cut out each one. As they cut, read each kind act to the class.
- Once the kids have the pieces cut, have them take one and bring the ends together to make a loop. Make sure the kind act is facing out. Have the kids tape or staple the ends together. Have them pick up the next piece and loop it through the first loop and tape those ends together. Have kids continue making their kindness chain by adding each strip.
- As they work, read the story of how Jacob stole the blessing from Genesis 27:1-10, 14-27. Remind the kids that Isaac spoke a blessing over the wrong son and couldn't take it back. We need to be careful with our words, too. We can't take our words back either. That's why we need to choose our words wisely and only say kind things.

Supplies needed: Paper chain template (pg. 5, 1 set per kid) Scissors, Tape/Staplers

OPTION 2: HIT THE TARGET LESSON REVIEW

Instructions:

- Before playing, tape two lines next to each other on the floor. Then, place 3 paper plates with a number value (page 6) to be the targets at varying distances from the lines (higher point value further away).
- Divide the class into two teams. Have them line up behind each line. Give the first kid in line a beanbag.
- Read a question from below to the first two kids in line. First to raise their hand gets a chance to answer. If correct, they get to toss their beanbag trying to hit one of the targets. Whichever target they land closest to, give them that amount of points for the correct answer. Have those kids go to the end of the line. Keep track of each team's points as you go. Team with the most points at the end, wins.

Questions:

- What are the names of the twins? (Jacob and Esau)
- 2. Who was the older brother? (Esau)
- Who tricked his father into giving a blessing? (Jacob)
- 4. T or F: The mom helped Jacob trick Isaac. (T)
- 5. What book is full of God's truth? (Bible)
- 6. What did Jacob steal? (blessing)
- 7. Who died on the cross for us? (Jesus)
- 8. Tor F: Our words don't matter. (F)
- 9. What was the birthright? (inheritance for firstborn)
- 10. Why did Jesus die for us? (Sin)

Supplies needed: Tape, 3 paper plates, Target values (pg. 6, tape a value to each plate), 2 Beanbags
