Joseph and the Cool Robe

Lesson Overview

In today's lesson, we're going to learn about a guy named Joseph. Joseph was one of Jacob's many sons and Joseph was the favorite. One day, Jacob gave Joseph a beautiful robe to show him how much he loved him. Joseph loved his robe because it made him feel special. Joseph's brothers hated the robe because it was a reminder that Joseph was the favorite. To make matters worse, Joseph told his brothers a dream he had that showed all of his brothers bowing down to him. Now, that really angered the brothers! So, they hatched a plan to get rid of Joseph. One day when they were all out working, they captured Joseph, ripped off his robe and sold him to some foreign traders who brought him to Egypt. Then, they dipped the robe in some blood and brought it back to Jacob saying that Joseph had been killed by animals. This is a crazy story but there is an important lesson to learn. Jealousy makes us do silly things that can really hurt people. Joseph's brothers made a terrible decision when they got rid of Joseph all because they didn't like the attention he got from their father. So kids, don't be jealous!

Big Idea

Being jealous can make us do silly things

Key Question

Why do we get jealous?

Memory Verse

1 Corinthians 13:4 "Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud."

Classroom Agenda

- 1. (5 min) Let kids start working on Activity Page #1.
- 2. (5 min) WARM UP: Describe a time you were jealous of a sibling or friend. How did it make you feel and what did you do? (Tip: We can be jealous about a cool toy or game someone got that we want. But, jealousy makes us angry and leads us to do silly things. Instead, we should trust God and be happy with what we have.)
- 3. (5 min) **PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard.** Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) KQ: Answer the Key Question. (Answer: Because we think we deserve what others have. (Jealousy comes from a selfish heart. Instead of being happy for someone else for what they have, we think we deserve it more than they do. So, we get angry and do silly things. God doesn't like this attitude. Instead of thinking we are so great and deserve whatever we want, we should be happy with whatever God gives us.)
 - **Bonus Questions:** Why do we get jealous? Why doesn't God like jealousy? **4-5th** How can you fight against being jealous? How can having the right thoughts help you to overcome jealousy?
- (5 min) EXPLORE: Read <u>Psalm 37:1-3</u>. What does this passage tell us not to do? Who should we trust in for all of our needs? (Answer: We shouldn't waste our time worrying about what others are doing or what they have. Instead, we should trust in God who knows our needs and will take care of us.)
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.
- 9. (5 min) **CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class.** Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents and remind them to go online to pursueGODkids.org to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: LESSON REVIEW SCAVENGER HUNT

Instructions:

- Before class, hide the Scavenger hunt items (page 5) around the room.
- Then, have the class search to find all of the items. Each time an item is found, tape it up on the whiteboard.
- Once all the items are found, see if the kids can tell you how each item fits into the story of Joseph.
 - Jacob-father of Joseph
 - Joseph- favorite son
 - Robe- gift Jacob gave to Joseph
 - Bible-where the story of Joseph is found

- Egypt-country that Joseph was brought to
- Brothers-jealous of Joseph and sold him into slavery
- Favorite-Joseph was the favorite son
- Dream-Joseph had a dream that brothers would bow down to him

Supplies needed: Scavenger hunt items (pg. 5, precut, colored or printed on colored paper), Tape

OPTION 2: HOW DOES THIS FIT INTO THE STORY?

Instructions:

- Before playing, place all the Scavenger Hunt items (page 5) in a bowl or basket.
- Read the story of Joseph from Genesis 37:1-14, 23-28 to the class.
- Then, have kids take turns coming up and pulling an item out of the bowl or basket. See if the class can explain how that item fits into the story of Joseph. Continue playing until all of the items have been identified.
 - Jacob-father of Joseph
 - Joseph- favorite son
 - Robe- gift Jacob gave to Joseph
 - Bible-where the story of Joseph is found
 - Egypt-country that Joseph was brought to
 - Brothers-jealous of Joseph and sold him into slavery
 - Favorite-Joseph was the favorite son
 - Dream-Joseph had a dream that brothers would bow down to him

Supplies needed: Scavenger hunt items (pg. 5, pre cut, 1 set per class) Bowl/Basket
