Lesson Overview

In today's lesson, we're going to talk about obedience. Think about your home and your school. I bet you have rules to follow in both of those places. At home, you probably need to keep your room clean, do your homework and brush your teeth. At school, you need to be quiet when the teacher is talking and be kind to other kids. These rules are meant to help you and to keep you safe. Well, did you know that God has some rules for us, too? He does and we find them in the Bible. The Bible is like our instruction manual for life. It tells us what's right and wrong. Our job is to obey the rules, just like at home and at school. Obedience is a big deal to God so we should work hard to be good at it. Here are three things to keep in mind about obedience. First, we should obey the first time. When we're told to do something, we shouldn't question why or ignore it. We should listen and obey right away. Second, we should choose to hang out with friends who are also obedient. They will help us to stay on track. Third, we should never stop being obedient, even when we become adults. God has rules for us to follow and when we obey them, we're kept safe and out of danger.

Big Idea

A wise kid will be obedient.

Memory Verse

Classroom Agenda

- 1. (5 min) Let kids start working on Activity Page #1.
- 2. (5 min) WARM UP: Name 3 rules you have at home. Name 2 rules you have at school. What happens if you disobey the rules?. (Tip: Rules are for our protection, and if we break them, we get in trouble.)
- 3. (5 min) PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard. Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) **KQ: Answer the Key Question.** (Answer: **We get into trouble.** (God's rules and our parents rules are for our protection. God doesn't give us rules because he's mean or because he doesn't want us to have fun. He gives us rules to keep us safe. He knows what's best for us so we need to follow his rules, not ours. And, being obedient keeps us out of trouble like being grounded from friends or video games.)
 - **Bonus Questions:** What happens when we disobey? How can breaking rules put us in danger? **4-5th** What are some rules your parents have that are meant to keep you safe? Why does God know what's best?
- 7. (5 min) EXPLORE: Read James 1:22-24. Why isn't just listening enough to please God? What does our obedience say to God or to our parents? (Answer: It isn't enough to just know the rules. We need to obey them or they can't help or protect us. When we obey, we're showing our love and respect for God and our parents. Disobeying is disrespectful and hurtful.)
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.
- 9. (5 min) CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class. Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents and remind them to go online to pursueGODkids.org to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: MEMORY VERSE GAME

Instructions:

- Before playing, divide the class into groups of 4. Give each group a set of Memory verse words (page 5-6).
- Have kids place the cards face down on the table or floor. When you say "Go!", have them race to put the words in the correct order to say the memory verse. First to do it correctly, wins.
- If you have time, give each group a Bible and have them each look up and read the following verses to the class.
 - Deuteronomy 11:1
 - Ephesians 6:1-3
 - John 14:15
 - Luke 11:28

Supplies needed: Memory verse words (pg. 5-6, pre cut, 1 set per group), Bibles

OPTION 2: FRASE THE VERSE GAME

Instructions:

- Before playing, write the verse nice and big up on the whiteboard with space between each word. Say the verse as a class.
- Then, invite a kid to come up and erase a word. See if the class can say the verse with that word missing. Continue having kids come up and erase a word until all the words are gone. See if the class can say it totally by memory.
- If you have time, put the kids into pairs and give each pair a Bible. Have them look up and read the following verses to the class.
 - Deuteronomy 11:1
 - Ephesians 6:1-3
 - John 14:15
 - Luke 11:28


