Lesson Overview

Today, we're talking about something every kid needs to know because it's for your protection. It begins with the letter "O". Can you guess? We're going to learn about obedience, specifically about the importance of obeying your parents! Did you know that God tells you to obey your parents in the Bible? He does, and if God tells us to do something, we better listen. There are 3 important reasons why you should obey. First, God tells you to obey. Second, it makes God happy when you do. Third, it protects you from trouble. Your parents give you rules to protect you and to keep you out of trouble. So, kids, remember to obey your parents. It's more important than even brushing your teeth or eating your veggies!

Big Idea

Kids should obey their parents.

Key Question

Why is it important to obey?

Memory Verse

Colossians 3:20 "Obey your parents, for this pleases the Lord."

Classroom Agenda

- (5 min) PLAY: Let kids start working on Activity Page #1. 2nd-3rd puzzle key: Obedience, Rules, Protection. Phrase: Obey your parents.
- (5 min) WARM UP: What are some rules you have to follow at school? What are some rules parents have to obey? (Tip:Your teacher has rules in class to keep everyone safe so you can learn. Parents have to follow rules, too. For example, they have to obey the rules when driving so not to hit someone else.)
- 3. (5 min) **PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard.** Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) KQ: Answer the Key Question. (Answer: Because God tells us to and it keeps us out of trouble. (God knows what's best for us so we need to listen to what he has to say. God gives us parents who help us to grow up to be responsible adults. They give us rules to keep us safe and to teach us what is right and wrong. Our job is to follow those rules. Choosing to disobey makes God sad and will only get us into trouble.)
 - **Bonus Questions:** Who tells us to obey our parents? Why should we obey? **4-5th:** What are some of your parents' rules that are meant to keep you safe?
- 7. (5 min) EXPLORE: Read John 15:14. What does Jesus mean that we are friends if we keep his commands? (Answer: When we love someone, we want to honor them, listen to them and make them proud. So, obeying your parents and what the Bible says, will show your parents and God how much you love them. Commands is just a fancy word for rules. So, Jesus is saying that we are his friends when we obey his rules because our obedience shows our love and respect for him.)
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.
- 9. (5 min) **CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class.** Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents and remind them to go online to pursueGOD.org/kids to find this week's lesson video.

OPTION 2: FOLLOW THE LEADER GAME

Instructions:

- Have kids take turns being the leader. The rest of the class lines up behind them. Encourage the leader to be creative as they lead the class around the room. Everyone else has to follow and obey exactly what the leader is doing.
- After the game, ask the class what happened when kids didn't listen and obey the leader. (kids got lost or hurt, made the game less fun, or made it hard for others to play)
- Remind the kids how important it is to obey their parents.

Because It the Lord

That means that it makes God happy. You want to make God happy, don't you? We should all want that, it's what we are supposed to do as Christians - even adult Christians! And if you want to be really good at making God happy when you're older, you need to start right now while you're young. Obeying your parents is one of the easiest ways to please God as a kid. So, do it!

Because It Us

Let me demonstrate. Let's take a Hula hoop. Look, at it as a big "O". "O" is for obedience! The Bible says that the rules God has given us and our parents are for our protection. When we obey, we are safe. When we disobey, we are in danger.
