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Lesson Overview

In today's lesson, we're learning about a conversation Jesus had with a guy named Nicodemus. Nicodemus was a Pharisee which means he was a smart Jewish guy who knew God's law inside and out. He thought he knew everything he needed to know about God. He thought he was really good. But, Nicodemus heard that Jesus was teaching that we all have a sin problem that makes us not good people. So, he went to meet Jesus to ask him some questions. Jesus challenged Nicodemus by telling him that just knowing the law wouldn't make him good enough for God. The only way to be good enough for God was by having a relationship with Jesus. Remember, Jesus is God, and he came to save us from our sin problem. So, it doesn't matter how smart we think we are or how much we know about the Bible, if we haven't trusted in Jesus, then our sins aren't forgiven. This was an important lesson for Nicodemus to understand and it's important for us, too. On our own, we can never be good enough for God. We need Jesus to forgive us and live in our hearts and help us to live for him.

Big Idea

The only way to become a Christian is by believing in Jesus.

Key Question

Why can't our good works save us?

Memory Verse

Classroom Agenda

- 1. (5 min) Let kids start working on Activity Page #1.
- 2. (5 min) WARM UP: Make a list of the good things you did this week. How about a list of some mistakes you made this week? (Tip: God doesn't count our good and bad things and then decide if he loves us. All we need is a relationship with Jesus!)
- 3. (5 min) PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard. Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) KQ: Answer the Key Question. (Answer: Because we have a major problem called sin. (The Bible is clear, we all have a sin problem that has broken our relationship with God. Sin is doing things our own way instead of God's way. The only cure for sin is Jesus. He came to die to pay for our sins so we could be free to live a life that honors God.)
 - **Bonus Questions:** What's our major problem? What is sin? Who is our only cure? **4-5th** Why do you think God cares about how we live? What do you think the world would be like if Jesus never came?
- 7. (5 min) EXPLORE: Read Ephesians 2:8-9. What is God's grace? Why can't we boast about our good deeds? (Answer: Grace is an undeserved gift. You can't do something to earn God's love, he loves you because he created you. And, his forgiveness is free for us, too. Jesus paid the price. All we have to do is accept the gift by trusting in Jesus. No room for bragging about our own good deeds. It's all because of Jesus!)
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.

(5 min) **CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class.** Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents - and remind them to go online to pursueGODkids.org to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: MEMORY VERSE GAME

Instructions:

- Divide the class into groups of 4. Give each group a set of Memory verse words (page 5-6). Have them place the words face down on the floor or table.
- When you say, "Go!" have the groups race to get the words in the correct order to say the memory verse. First to do it correctly, wins.

Supplies needed: Memory verse template (pg. 5-6, precut, 1 set per group),

OPTION 2: ERASE THE VERSE GAME

Instructions:

- Before playing, write the memory verse up on the whiteboard big enough for the kids to read and with some space between each word. Say the verse as a class.
- Invite one kid up to erase two words. Then, see if the class can say the verse with those two words missing. Continue inviting kids up to erase words and each time see if the class can say the verse.
- Once all the words have been erased, see if the class can say the verse totally from memory.


