Lesson Overview

In today's lesson, we're going to talk about generosity. Generosity is all about being a giver, not a taker. If you're generous, then you're willing to give some of your money, a favorite toy or even your lunch to help someone in need. Perhaps you've been on the receiving end of a generous person. Think about your parents. They spend their hard earned money to feed you, buy you clothes and take you on vacation. That's pretty generous! But, there is an even better example of a generous person we all know. It's Jesus! Jesus didn't just give money or spend time with people, he gave his life for the whole world! He knew that in order to save us from our sins, he would have to die to pay for our mistakes. Isn't that amazing? So kids, even though you don't have a lot of money or stuff, find ways to be generous with your friends and family. Be willing to give your snack to a friend or let your younger sibling have one of your favorite toys. Be like Jesus.

Memory Verse

Classroom Agenda

1. (5 min) **PLAY: Let kids start working on Activity Page #1.**
2. (5 min) **WARM UP: Name some generous people in your life. How have they been generous and how did their generosity affect you?** (Tip: Maybe it's your parents, grandparents or a fun aunt or uncle. Generous people love to give us nice things. Jesus is the most generous in that he gave up his life for us!)
3. (5 min) **PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard.** Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
4. (20 min) **LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids.** Then return to class to finish this guide.
5. (2 min) **RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).**
6. (3 min) **KQ: Answer the Key Question.** (Answer: **He gave up his life to save us.** (This is the greatest act of love of all time. Jesus chose to suffer and die to pay for OUR sins, not his. He did it to save us and to give us new life. Not only that, he has a plan for our lives and helps us to accomplish it, and he is listening to and answering our prayers every day. Now, that's generous!))
 - **Bonus Questions:** What did Jesus do for us? What are some other generous things that Jesus does for us?
4-5th: How can you be more generous toward your friends and family?
7. (5 min) **EXPLORE: Read Proverbs 11:24-25. Why are stingy people not happy in the end? Why do generous people feel refreshed?** (Answer: Our money and our stuff will never make us happy. Stingy people think that their stuff is more important than people so they want hang onto it rather than share it. So, they miss out on the joy of giving. When we understand all that Jesus has done for us, we should be glad to help others because we understand how much God has blessed us.)
8. (10 min) **PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.**
9. (5 min) **CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class.** Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents - and remind them to go online to pursueGOD.org/kids to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: THE WIDOW'S MITE CRAFT

Instructions:

- Give each kid a Coin template (page 5).
- Have kids cut out each item and have them color the coin.
- Then have them glue the verse and phrase onto the coin.
- As they work, read the story of the widow from [Luke 21:1-4](#). Remind the kids that being generous is not about being rich, it's about being sacrificial with what you have to help someone else. Jesus is the best example of generosity as he gave his life for us!

Supplies needed: Coin template (pg. 5, 1 set per kid), Scissors, Crayons, Glue

OPTION 2: MEMORY VERSE GAME

Instructions:

- Have the kids get into groups of 4. Give each group a set of Memory verse words (page 6-7).
- Have them spread them out on the floor. When you say, "Go!", have them race to get the words in the correct order to say the memory verse. First to do it, wins.

One day Jesus was at the temple and he saw some rich people putting A LOT of money in the offering box. Then a widow who didn't have a lot of money came by and gave just two small coins. That doesn't seem like a lot of money, but to her that was everything. That was all the money she had. Jesus told all of the people there, that even though she gave a lot less money, she was way more generous because she gave all that she had. You probably don't have a lot, but you can still choose to be generous with the things you do have!

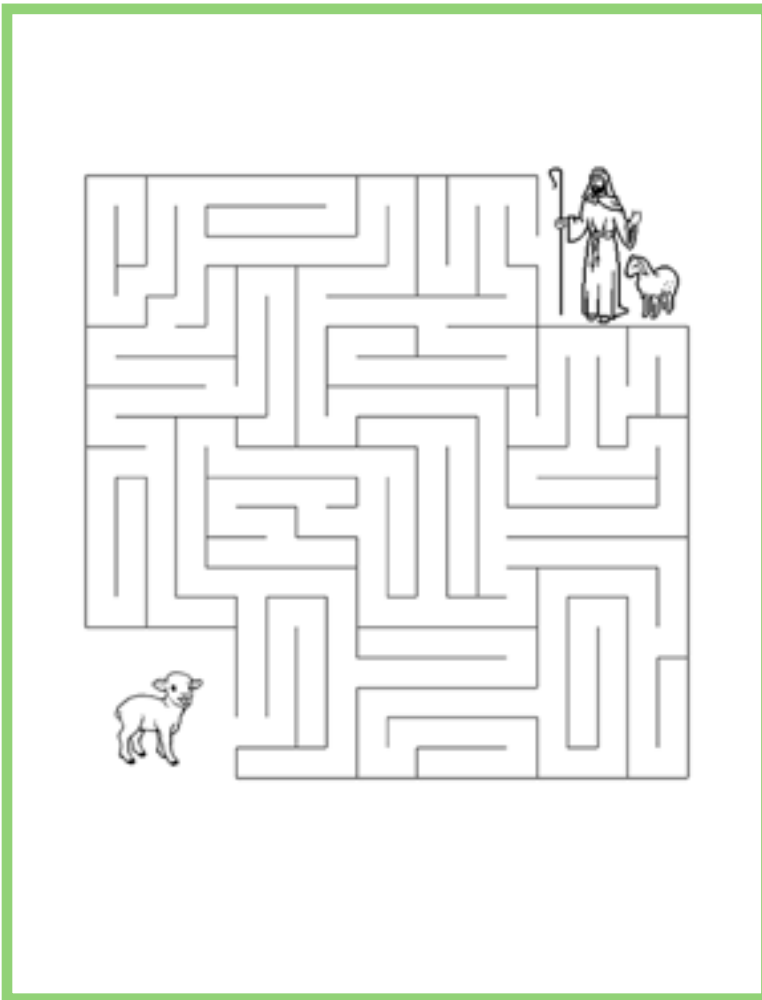
When We're Generous, We're Like _____!
