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Lesson Overview

In today's lesson, we're going to learn about a crazy dream that Peter had. Peter was one of Jesus' early disciples who was one of the key leaders in the church. Like Paul, Peter would teach people about Jesus. One day, God came to Peter in a vision. A vision is like you're dreaming, but you're not asleep. In the vision, Peter sees a big sheet full of animals and a voice tells Peter to eat the animals. In the Jewish tradition, there were certain animals that were considered "unclean" and Jews couldn't eat the meat from those animals. But, some of those "unclean" animals were in the vision. So, Peter said, "No way!" But, God was teaching Peter a lesson and it wasn't really about animals. It was about people. Just like certain animals, Jews also thought non-Jews, or Gentiles, were unclean and unimportant people. They didn't think they were worthy of God's love. But, that wasn't God's heart at all. Jesus came to die for everyone, Jews and Gentiles. So, Peter realized that the Gentiles deserved to hear about Jesus, too.

Classroom Agenda

- 1. (5 min) PLAY: Let kids start working on Activity Page #1. 2nd-5th puzzle key: Cornelius, Peter, Unclean, Gentiles, Jesus. God makes everyone clean.
- 2. (5 min) WARM UP: Think about a country in the world. How do they dress and what do they like to eat? How are they different from you? (Tip: Every country has its own cultures and traditions and they're different than yours. And, God loves them as much as he loves us.)
- 3. (5 min) PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard. Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) KQ: Answer the Key Question. (Answer: Sin makes us dirty. (The Bible says that we are all born with a sin problem. That means we all have a desire to go our own way instead of God's way. That's why Jesus came to die for us. He came to break the power of sin, to forgive our sins, and to give us the Holy Spirit to help us to live for him instead of ourselves. We are all made clean through Jesus.)
 - **Bonus Questions:** What is sin? Why does sin keep us from God? What did Jesus do to fix it? **4-5th**: Make a list of sinful things kids might do. Why do those things make God sad?
- 7. (5 min) EXPLORE: Read Galatians 3:28. Who can be a part of God's family? What does it mean to be one with Christ? (Answer: Anyone can be a part of God's family! It doesn't matter if you're a boy or girl, if you're rich or if you speak English or Spanish. God loves everyone and Jesus died for everyone. So, the way we become one with Christ, is to put our trust in him. We ask him to forgive our sins and invite him to live in our hearts.
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.
- 9. (5 min) CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class. Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents and remind them to go online to pursueGOD.org/kids to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: LESSON REVIEW MATCHING GAME

Instructions:

- Divide the class into groups of 4. Give each group a set of Matching Cards (page 5-6).
- Have them place the cards face down on the floor. When you say, "Go!", have the groups play a game of concentration where one kid starts by flipping over two cards. If a match, he gets to keep those cards and go again. If no match, the kid to the right gets a turn.
- Continue playing until all the matches are found. Kid with the most cards, wins.

Supplies needed: Matching Cards template (pg. 5-6, precut, 1 set per group)

OPTION 2: HOW DOES THAT FIT INTO THE STORY?

Instructions:


- Before class, cut up the Matching Cards template (page 5-6) and place one of each word or picture into a bowl.
- Have kids come up and draw a card from the bowl. See if they can remember how that word or picture fits into the story. Continue having kids draw a card until all of them are gone.
 - Peter: Disciple of Jesus and leader in the church
 - Cornelius: A gentile. Peter went to his house to share about Jesus.
 - Jews: God's chosen people who followed the OT laws.
 - Gentiles: Non-jews who didn't follow the Jewish laws and traditions
 - Vision: Like a dream and a way God communicated with Peter.
 - Acts: NT book where story is found.
- Then, read the story from Acts 10:1-36 and see how the kids did on re-telling the story.


