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e11 BIBLE STORYLINE The Church Is Born

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Lesson Overview

Last week, we learned why it's important to go to church. Well, today, we're going to learn about the very first church ever! It was a really long time ago and we learn about it in the book of Acts in the New Testament. The first church was born after Jesus came and died for our sins and rose again on Easter. Before Jesus left, he told his followers that they needed to go and tell everyone about him. So, one day, Peter stood up in front of a crowd and started telling people about Jesus. Now, many people in the crowd new that Peter was a fisherman yet he was acting more like a pastor giving a sermon! But, Peter's message was capturing their attention and they were curious about Jesus. That day, thousands of people decided to follow Jesus and the first church was born! They would all gather together to learn about Jesus, pray, and even eat meals together. They were like one big family. And, guess what? We can all be a part of God's Church when we put our trust in Jesus.

Big Idea

Everyone who believes in Jesus is a part of his Church.

Key Question

What do we have to do to trust in Jesus?

Memory Verse

Acts 4:32 "All the believers were united in heart and mind."

Classroom Agenda

- 1. (5 min) PLAY: Let kids start working on Activity Page #1.
- 2. (5 min) WARM UP: Share your birth story. (Where were you born, how big were you, hair, eye color) (Tip: It's fun to hear stories of what we looked like when we were born. Today, we'll learn how the church was born.)
- 3. (5 min) **PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard.** Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) KQ: Answer the Key Question. (Answer: Tell Jesus that we're sorry for our sins and invite him into our hearts. (The Bible says that we all have a sin problem. That means that we all want to do things are own way instead of God's way. But, Jesus came to fix that problem by dying on the cross to pay for our sins. That means, with his help, we can say "No" to sin and "Yes" to obeying God. So, we need to ask Jesus for forgiveness and invite him into our hearts so he can help us to honor him.)
 - **Bonus Questions:** What is sin? What do we have to do to believe in Jesus? **4-5th**: What are some things you can do to remember what Jesus has done for you? What can you do to honor God with your life?
- 7. (5 min) EXPLORE: Read <u>Romans 10:9-10</u>. What do we need to believe about Jesus to be saved? How does he make us right with God? (Answer: We have to understand that Jesus is God. He is perfect and all powerful and that's why he could pay for our sins. Our job is to put our trust in him, and when we do, our sins are forgiven. From that day on, the Bible says we will live a new life in him. And, we'll get to live in heaven with him some day.)
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.
- 9. (5 min) **CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class.** Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents and remind them to go online to pursueGOD.org/kids to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: THE CHURCH IS BORN MATCHING GAME

Instructions:

- Divide the class up into groups of 4. Give each group a set of Matching cards (page 5-6).
- Have them place the cards face down on the floor. Have the groups play like a game of concentration where one kid starts by flipping over two cards. If they find a match, they get to keep those cards and try again. If not, they flip the cards back over and the next kid gets a chance to find a match.
- Continue playing until all the matches are found. Kid with most cards, wins.

Supplies needed: Matching cards template (pg. 5-6, pre cut, 1 set per group)

OPTION 2: JESUS HEALS OUR HEART CRAFT

Instructions:

- Give each kid a Heart template (page 7).
- Have them cut out each item and color. Have them glue the bandaids onto their heart and place the Big Idea at the bottom of the heart.
- As they work, remind the kids that anyone can be a part of God's church by trusting in Jesus. When we trust Jesus, we are in God's family and we are part of his Church.

Supplies needed: Heart template (pg. 7, 1 per kid), Scissors, Crayons, Glue
