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Lesson Overview

In today's lesson, we're going to learn about a famous story in the Bible about David and Goliath. David was the youngest son in his family and his job was to take care of the family's sheep. His older brothers were soldiers in king Saul's army. David would go out to visit his brothers on the battlefield to bring them food and supplies. One day, David went to the battlefield and heard this big giant teasing the Israelite army. His name was Goliath and he was a huge, mean dude. The Israelite soldiers were afraid of him and Goliath knew it. So, he taunted the Israelites telling them to come out to fight him. He said that if they beat him, the Philistine people would do whatever the Israelites wanted. David heard what Goliath was saying and he was angry that nobody was brave enough to fight Goliath. So, David told king Saul that he would fight the giant. David knew that God was on his side so he wasn't afraid. He picked up his slingshot and some rocks and went out to face Goliath. He put a rock in his sling and slung it at Goliath hitting him square in the head! The giant fell and the Israelite soldiers couldn't believe it! Here's the point. David knew God was with him so he was brave. God is with us in any battle we face, too, so we can be brave like David.

Anyone can win when God is on their side

Classroom Agenda

- 1. (5 min) Let kids start working on Activity Page #1.
- 2. (5 min) WARM UP: Share a time you were afraid to do something but you did it anyways. (Tip: Maybe you had to give a speech or try out for a new team. David knew he didn't need to be scared with God on his side.)
- 3. (5 min) PREVIEW: Write out the Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Key Question on a whiteboard. Have the kids copy it down on Activity Page #1 (if applicable).
- 4. (20 min) LARGE GROUP: Gather for songs and videos with other kids. Then return to class to finish this guide.
- 5. (2 min) RECAP: Read the Lesson Overview (see above).
- 6. (3 min) KQ: Answer the Key Question. (Answer: Because he knew God was in charge. (As a shepherd, David experienced God's protection a lot. David had to fight off lions and other scary animals to save his sheep and God was with him every time. So, when David saw Goliath, he wasn't afraid. He knew God would help him to defeat him, too. David also understood that defeating Goliath was another way God would prove his power.)
 - **Bonus Questions:** What was David's job and how did that job prepare him for this battle? **4-5th** When you're afraid, what will you do to remember that God is with you and will help you to be brave?
- 7. (5 min) EXPLORE: Read <u>Deuteronomy 31:6</u>. What does this verse say to us? What does this verse say about **God?** (Answer: We should be strong, courageous and we don't need to be afraid. God is in charge and he is with us in every situation. He won't fail us or leave us.)
- 8. (10 min) PLAY: Choose a group activity from Activity Page #2.
- 9. (5 min) **CLOSE: Share prayer requests and pray as a class.** Encourage kids to use the Family Guide at home with their parents and remind them to go online to pursueGODkids.org to find this week's lesson video.

Teacher instructions: Choose an activity for your classroom.

OPTION 1: DAVID'S SLINGSHOT CRAFT

Instructions:

- Give each kid a half sheet of construction paper, Slingshot template (page 5), 3 popsicle sticks and a pipe cleaner.
- Have the kids glue the popsicles on their paper making a "Y". Then, have them glue each end of the pipe cleaner to the top of the "Y" making a sling. Then, have them glue the Big Idea and Memory verse in the bottom left part of their paper. Give them 5 craft balls and have them glue those at the bottom right part of the paper.
- As they work, read the story of David and Goliath from 1 Samuel 17:4-11,32-37, 48-49. Remind the kids that David wasn't afraid because he knew God was on his side. We don't have to be afraid, either, because God will help us fight any battle we face, too.

Supplies needed: Half sheets of construction paper (1 per kid), Slingshot template (pg. 5, pre cut, 1 set per kid) Popsicle sticks (3 per kid), Pipe Cleaners (1 per kid), Craft puff balls (5 per kid), Glue
